Classroom News



Collaboration, learning our sight words, celebrating 100 Days of School, learning bhangra folk dance, exploring new applications and technology, and serving the community.

A message from our Teacher

The students have had a joy-filled week with our celebration of 100 Days of School, dance learning about Bhangra style of dancing and look forward to learning about the dances of different cultures each week.

We have been focusing more closely on the virtue of thankfulness this week, considering the many things at school, home and in our lives more broadly that we are thankful for. This has been done quite intentionally in order to ensure that the students are always trying to see the world in a positive light and remember that they often have many things to be grateful for, rather than complain about.

What have we been learning?

Students have continued their phonics instruction, with Stage 1 focusing on the digraph 'ea' and learning about the different phonemes this digraph can represent. For example, /ea/ for leaf or /ea/ for head. The students have also focused on understanding the structure of information reports as well as reading procedures.

Early Stage 1 have learnt the /or/ and /ur/ digraphs. They have also been trying to memorise all of their sight words before learning new ones. Both stages have also learnt more about common nouns and proper nouns in grammar.



Sorting words into their corresponding sounds collaboratively. Creativity, as our virtue of the week, has been explored across many disciplines, including creativity in our writing, in our designs using 2D shapes, dance, drawings and artworks.

In mathematics, we have been focusing on 2D shapes. With Kindergarten focusing on naming, identifying their properties and manipulating them both with hands on materials and using digital applications. Stage 1 has also expanded their knowledge of a variety of shapes and focused on concepts such as how a shape does not change even when it's size or orientation changes (flips, slides and turns). They have also learnt about symmetry and explored this concept through art and painting.
